A \$500 Visual Art Cash Award will be given to a student graduating during 2010 from a Tri-City area high school. In addition there will be two honorable mention awards of \$125 each. At the discretion of the judges, these awards will be presented in recognition of the student's accomplishments in the visual arts during his/her school years.

RULES:

1. Applicant must be a graduating senior of a Tri-Cities area high school.
2. Applicant must deliver an application and portfolio of his/her work to the Allied Arts Association Scholarship Committee between **April 6-10, 2010** at the Gallery, 89 Lee Boulevard, Richland, Washington.
3. Each portfolio must include an itemized list and explanation of work item and have the following information plainly printed on the back upper right hand corner of each piece of work.:

4. **The portfolio submitted must contain five, but no more than ten enclosures of art.** Art may be in more than one media. Portfolio pieces need not be matted when submitted for judging. Photographs or slides may be used for three dimensional work or exceptionally large pieces of flat work only; however, original art is preferred. Work submitted by photo or on CD must include a clearly written explanation of each piece.

ANY STUDENT SUBMITTING MORE THAN 10 PIECES WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE VISUAL ART AWARD.

5. The applicant must submit a one-page typed resume with the portfolio.
6. The Award recipient agrees to exhibit his/her work in the gallery at the Annual Allied Arts Scholarship and Award **Show** during the period **May 4-28, 2010**. Award recipients are required to be present at the show's **reception on Sunday, 1-3 p.m., May 16, 2010**. Work selected for show by judges must be prepared to hang, i.e., matted and mounted. Framed work must be wired for hanging.
7. Student work selected for show should be **picked up Saturday May 29, 2010**. Students whose work is not selected for show will be notified to pick up their work as soon as judging is completed.

Board members and their immediate families are not eligible to receive cash awards or scholarships.
